The DARE graduations have begun. The first was at Mary Queen of Peace at 2pm on Apr. 2nd. If you are not aware, DARE, Drug Awareness Resistance Education, is taught to the 5th grade classes in the parochial schools. Webster public schools don't have the time to commit to this program, and teach a modified version of another program.

Our club donates \$3,000, and is the only funding the DARE program gets. This allows the Webster Police to teach the 5th graders how different drugs, along with smoking affect the body. If our donation can keep just one child from experimenting with drugs or smoking, it is worth it. They also talk about bullying, and how to avoid being bullied.
