Over the past year fellow WG Lion Dennis Donze has been busy as District 26M-2 Extension Chairperson. Early on as part of the District MERL Team (Membership, Extension, Retention, Leadership) he was involved in reviving the Shrewsbury & St. Ann Lions Clubs. Our Club purchased a projector to support his efforts. This allows him to make Powerpoint presentations to prospective members. As a Club we have been financially supportive supplying signage, soda, water and miscellaneous Lion related items. Both Clubs are now active in their respective communities with 5 members each. More members are being sought. Lion Dennis was presented with a Lions International President's

Commendation at the District Convention in March! An Extension Seminar was put on in March by Lion Jim Canon from Lion International's Global Membership Team. Dennis then began targeting business and political leaders in the Wildwood area. In May a series of informational meetings were held. A minimum of 20 members is needed to charter a new Lions Club. On June 23<sup>rd</sup> LCI recognized the Chartering of the Wildwood Area Lions Club. To date 36 individuals are Charter Members. October 10th is the "Charter Night" celebrating the formation of District 26M-2's first new Lions Club. Cost is \$25/person which includes dinner and drinks. Still, I was very gratified to read in the Summary that three (3) people were professionally counseled pertaining to their readings. If our Club was able to help a few people, the effort was quite worthwhile.

And, of course, our Club was able to present a donation to Dr. Charles Kilo for the continued funding of his internationally-acclaimed research and educational Foundation.

## **Key facts about Seasonal Flu**

What is the flu? The flu is a contagious respiratory illness caused by influenza viruses. It can cause mild to severe illness it can even lead to death. The best way to prevent the flu is by getting a flu vaccination each year.

Every year in the United States on Average:

- 5% to 20% of the population gets the flu;
- more than 200,000 people are hospitalized from flu complications;
- 36,000 people die from the flu related causes;

Some people such as older people, younger kids and people with health conditions are at a higher risk.

Symptoms of the flu include:

- fever (usually high)
- headache
- extreme tiredness
- dry cough
- sore throat
- runny or stuffy nose
- muscle aches
- stomach symptoms

## How Flu Spreads

Flu viruses are thought to spread mainly from person to person through coughing or sneezing of people with the flu. Sometimes people may become infected by touching something with the flu viruses on it and then touching their mouth or nose.

Most healthy adults may be able to infect others before they even know they have the flu or have symptoms.
