The Webster Lions community project in late January will be to invite the people of Webster Groves to help the Webster Lions spend \$8,500 (or more) on a physical need within the community. The Webster Lions have selected the amount of \$8,500 because the Webster Groves Lions Club will celebrate our Club's 85th Anniversary on March 12, 2010. Hopefully, our Club will select a worthwhile project during the month of February and publicly announce the project on our Club's 85th Anniversary date.

The Webster Groves Lions Club will be open and receptive to all public suggestions for a physical need (e.g., a clock tower, athletic field improvements, flagpoles, park benches, etc.). If the Club's budgeted funds are not sufficient to fulfill a worthwhile project, the Webster Lions will be willing to be a partner with others (e.g., the City, the School District, a business district, etc.) to complete a worthwhile community project.

The Webster Groves Lions Club is seeking a worthwhile physical project in the community in order to continue our Club's 80-year tradition of providing a tangible community gift (i.e., "paw-print") once per decade. In the 1920's, for example, the Webster Lions purchased playground equipment for a city park and contributed funds to the construction of a notfor-profit "old folks" home. In the 1930's, the Webster Lions financed and constructed municipal tennis courts. In the 1940's, the Webster Lions financed and constructed municipal baseball and softball fields. In the 1950's, the Webster Lions financed the addition of a wading pool at the municipal swimming pool. In the 1970's, the Webster Lions were major contributors for- the relocation an 1850's historic home to a municipal park. Also, in the 1970's, the Webster Lions were major contributors to improvements to the High School football and track

stadium. In the 1980's, the Webster Lions were major contributors to the construction of the Webster Groves History Center (which our Club utilizes for our meetings!). In the 1990's, the Webster Lions installed commercial-grade electrical wiring in a municipal park. And, at the start of the New Millennium, the Webster Lions funded a new back-stop, fencing and dug-outs for a municipal ball field. With 2010 upon us and an 85th Anniversary, too, it is time for the Webster Lions to identify and put in place a needed physical item within the community.

Heart of the Community Banquet

Lion Ryan Whittington will be honored as Business person of the Year. Also our two Lions of the years for 2008 will be honored as well. The banquet is February 5th 2010.
